A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

2019 Youth Trip to New York City



This July a group of youth from St Paul's will join with youth from other churches, load a bus, and head toward the "Big Apple" for the 2019 Youth Mission Trip. They will spend a week working with the Youth Service Opportunities

Project in New York City. YSOP engages youth, college students and adults in service experiences through an innovative program that combines an orientation to the issues, hands on volunteer work and reflection.

Founded in 1983, YSOP is a non-profit organization rooted in the Quaker principals of integrity, equality, community, simplicity, and peace. Each year it welcomes, over 4,000 volunteers of all different faiths to their programs in D.C. and New York to serve more than 500,000 people experiencing homelessness and hunger.

Our youth will spend Monday through Thursday working at service sites. On Friday we will spend some time touring New York City. In the past, the most memorable part of the experience was the evening dinner with the homeless. On one night our youth will work to prepare a meal for homeless guests invited to YSOP through various partner organizations for dinner, games, and conversation.

In the coming months we will be working on fundraisers to aid in paying for the trip. Beginning on Sunday, January 27th we will start our monthly Noisy Can Offerings (on the last Sunday of each month). The collections will be a Love Offering to organizations we work with to help support their ministries.

This summer will mark our 10th Mission Trip together. Thanks to your support, we have sent youth from our church to the Heifer Ranch, Oaks Indian Mission, Appalachian Service Project, Kure Beach Ministry, Youthworks and Youth Service Opportunities Project in N.Y.C. and Washington D.C. Together they have done thousands of hours of service work, traveled to new places, worked with dozens of different ministries, and met people they will never forget. This year will allow a new group of youth to work with YSOP. For several teenagers, this will be their first Mission Trip. Please know how deeply we appreciate your support of our youth and their faith development.

Current monthly budgeted amount for November is \$12,536.09. Actual November amount received was \$11,197.00. Benevolence monthly budgeted amount is \$1,000.00 and the actual income received in November was \$541.00.


